HEROIC LIVES

Saint Clare of Assisi

Saint Clare of Assisi was born into a noble family in Assisi in 1194. Inspired by the preaching and example of Saint Francis, she felt called to dedicate her life completely to God. In 1212, she left her family home and placed herself under the spiritual guidance of Saint Francis, who gave her the religious habit and cut her hair as a sign of her dedication to Christ.

Clare eventually established a community at San Damiano, where she became the abbess of a new religious family known as the Poor Clares. Together with her sisters, she embraced a life of prayer, humility, simplicity, and radical poverty, following the spirit of Saint Francis.

Throughout her life, Saint Clare was a woman of deep faith and prayer. Her devotion to the Eucharist was especially strong, and tradition tells of miracles attributed to her faith and trust in God's presence. She remained faithful to Christ even through illness and suffering, becoming a powerful witness to the Gospel.

FROM THE PEN OF ST. ANTHONY OF PADUA

"If you preach Jesus, He softens hardened hearts; if you call upon Him, He sweetens bitter temptations; if you think of Him, He enlightens your heart."

Saint Clare died in Assisi on August 11, 1253, and was canonized just two years later by Pope Alexander IV.

Saint Clare reminds us that holiness begins with a simple and courageous "yes" to God. Her life invites us to trust in the Lord, treasure the Eucharist, embrace humility, and serve others with love. May her example inspire us to place Christ at the center of our lives and to follow Him with joyful faith.
